Jackie is well known as a compliance trainer and has developed training courses delivered in person and online. She also has extensive experience in developing and guiding companies in management systems such as various International Standards Organization (ISO) standards. The Program has successfully been conducted for colleges and universities in the States of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, New Jersey, North Carolina, Tennessee and Texas. Approximately 240 institutions were audited, guided through corrective actions, and introduced to Environmental Management Systems (EMS). Ms. Baxley has planned and executed some of the largest university peer audits, including those conducted at the University of Alabama at Birmingham, Auburn University, Vanderbilt University, Emory University, Savannah College of Art and Design, and Baylor University.

Ms. Baxley has assisted facilities ranging from small private colleges to large international paper mills in the development and auditing of their environmental management systems. She has conducted training workshops and developed templates to aid facilities in developing an EMS built on the principles of Plan-Do-Check-Act. Well known for her training presentations, Ms. Baxley has trained hundreds over the years in RCRA hazardous waste, DOT hazardous materials, IATA Dangerous Goods, SPCC Plans, Overall EH&S compliance and many more. Ms. Baxley has presented seminars and training sessions both to large, multi-sector groups as well as tailored, individual settings. Training sessions have ranged in attendance from just a few to over 100 and have been presented in person as well as on-line.
